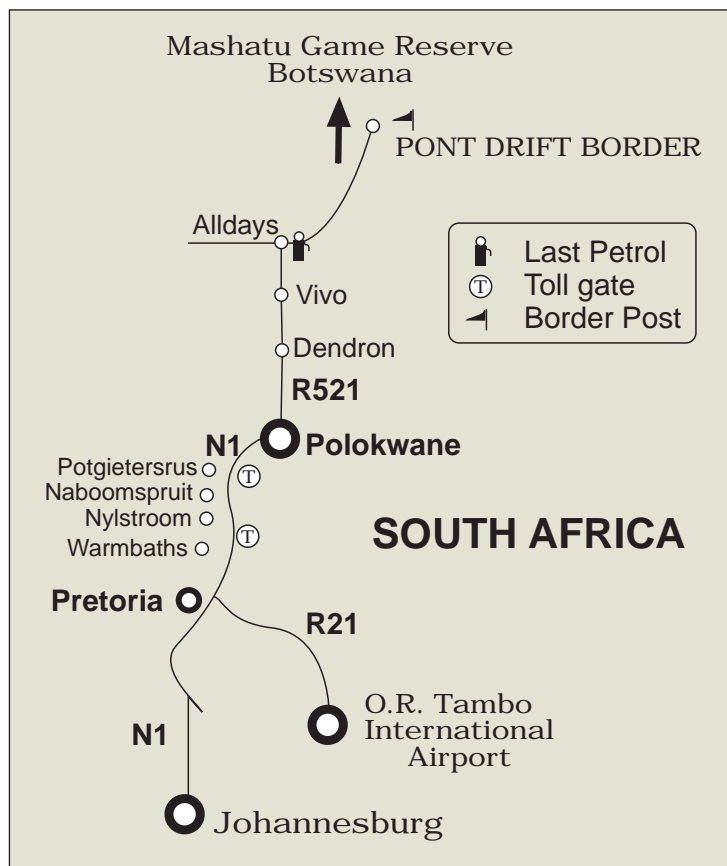




Directions from Johannesburg to Mashatu Game Reserve/ Pont Drift Border

Please remember Customs and Immigration close at 4.00pm daily.



Approximate distances:

- JHB to Polokwane 300km
- Polokwane to Pont Drift 204km
- JHB to Pont Drift 5.5 hours drive approx.

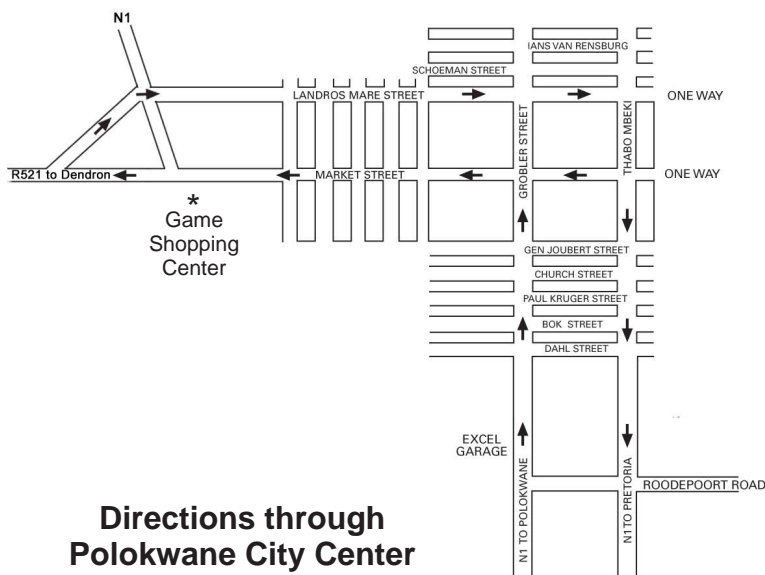
- Follow signboards on the N1 from Johannesburg and Pretoria to Polokwane (formerly Pietersburg).

N1 signboards from Johannesburg indicate Polokwane but further north, signs have not been changed so they may still indicate "Pietersburg".

- At Polokwane please follow signs on the R521 past Dendron and Vivo to Alldays. Please take care as this is a rural road and is unfenced. Look out for free-roaming herds of goats, cattle and wildlife.

- Please note that the last unleaded fuel station is at Alldays and is not operated 24 hours a day. We recommend you fill up in Polokwane before continuing to the Pont Drift Border Post, a distance of approximately 200km.

- Further along, the road has potholes. Please drive slowly and carefully.

DIRECTIONS THROUGH POLOKWANE WHEN TRAVELLING FROM JOHANNESBURG TO MASHATU

When arriving at Polokwane do NOT take the first turning left to Dendron but rather enter the Polokwane city center on Groblers street. Turn left into Market street. Travel until you see the Game Shopping Center on your left. At this point the road forks left to Dendron/ Vivo /Alldays (R521) and right towards Messina/ Beit Bridge. Stay LEFT towards Dendron/ Vivo /Alldays on the R521.

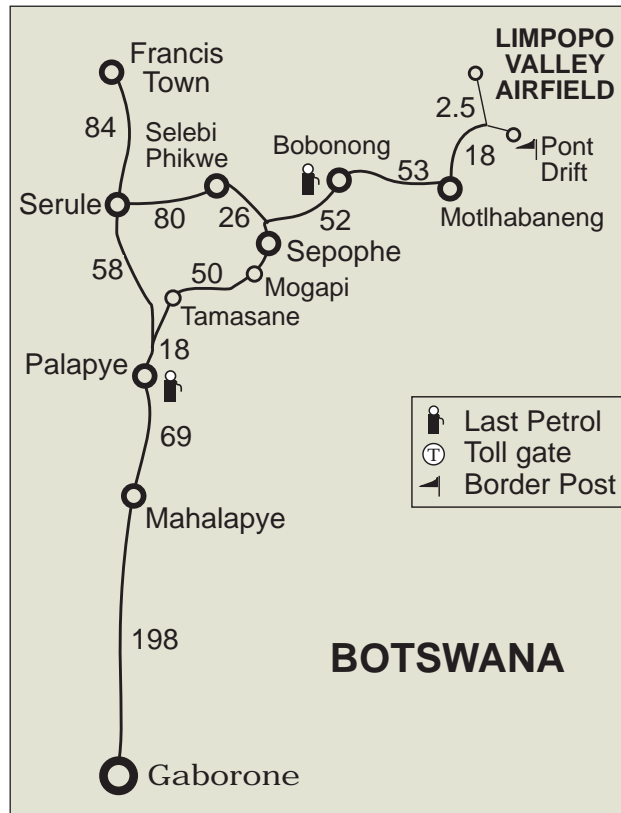
DIRECTIONS THROUGH POLOKWANE WHEN TRAVELLING FROM MASHATU TO JOHANNESBURG

Upon entering the outskirts of Polokwane on the R521 from Dendron/ Vivo/ Alldays, ignore the 1st turnoff to "N1 Pretoria" (the Vermukuliet Street turnoff). Continue into and through the city centre of Polokwane on "Landros Marais Street". Look out for an overhead sign board indicating "N1 Pretoria" to the right (Thabo Mbeki Street turnoff). Turn right and continue with Thabo Mbeki Street and you will end up on the N1 Toll Road to Pretoria/ Johannesburg.



Directions from Gaborone to Mashatu Game Reserve

FROM BOBONONG TO MASHATU / PONT DRIFT BORDER POST

Approximate distances:

- Gaborone to Mashatu Game Reserve (via Palapye, Mogapi, Bobonong and Motlhabaneng)	516km
- Tarred	482km
- Untarred	34km

- At the first (and only) traffic circle in Bobonong fork to the right.
- Drive approximately 1 km to T-junction – turn **right** at the T-junction towards **Mathatane** (sign posted to **Mathatane**).
- Drive approximately 0,7 kms and turn **left** to **Tuli Farms/Mathatane** (the sign board at this junction was broken by road contractors and may not have been replaced, but it is the only tar road going off to the left).
- Drive 50 km, turn **left** to **Motlhabaneng** (sign posted to **Mothabaneng**).
- Drive 15 kms on a good dirt road, over a short bridge and then across a long bridge across the Motloutse River.
- Once across the Motloutse River bridge drive through the village of **Motlhabaneng** – on the main dirt road.
- Stay on the main dirt road. A couple of kms outside of the village, at a fork in the road, you will start seeing yellow “Mashatu” signboards. **Fork to the right** and follow these signs for 8 kms to a gate in the veterinary fence.
- Drive through the gate and continue for 12kms on the main dirt road to crossroads. Turn **left** at crossroads.
- Drive 2 kms to another veterinary fence – go through the gate.
- Drive 12 kms to T-junction, turn **left** to **Limpopo Valley Airfield** (sign posted to **Limpopo Valley Airfield**)
- Drive 2,5 kms to the **Limpopo Valley Airfield** where your guide will meet you.

NB: THESE ARE THE ONLY ROUTES WE RECOMMEND. You are directed through the village of Motlhabaneng because there is a bridge across the Motloutse River at Motlhabaneng. Any other route will involve driving across Motloutse River bed which is either soft sand, deep water or both. Should you ignore our recommendation to go via Motlhabaneng you do so at your own peril – **EVEN IN A 4X4!!**

NOTE: The above road conditions are generally 2 X 4 friendly but may not be depending upon weather conditions prevailing at the time.
